E-safety:

Exploring image sharing with primary-ages pupils...

There is a really good set of animations and a resource pack to talk to primary aged children about image sharing, the importance of consent and how to ask for help if they have a problem online. The key message for children throughout Jessie and Friends is that if a child ever feels worried about anything that happens online, they should seek help from an adult they trust.

Further learning outcomes include identifying and responding safely to manipulative, pressurising and unhealthy behaviour online, and considering the safety and rights of themselves and other children when sharing content online.

National Crime Agency Latest Report...

On the 14th may the National Crime Agency released their report and some of their figures are staggering.

Regarding child sexual abuse, the number of referrals of online child sexual abuse has increased by 700% since 2012; the NCA states that there are nearly 2.9 million accounts registered on the worst child sexual abuse sites on the dark web worldwide, and they believe more than 5% of these accounts are offenders in the United Kingdom which equates to roughly 145,000 individuals in the UK.

This is a constant uphill battle, not just for law enforcement, but for parents and us that work with children, we cannot take our eye off the ball.
