National Crime Agency Latest Report...

On the 14th may the National Crime Agency released their report and some of their figures are staggering.

Regarding child sexual abuse, the number of referrals of online child sexual abuse has increased by 700% since 2012; the NCA states Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> July that there are nearly 2.9 million accounts registered on the worst child sexual abuse sites on the dark web worldwide, and they believe Friday 19<sup>th</sup> July 2019 more than 5% of these accounts are offenders in the United Kingdom which equates to roughly 145,000 individuals in the UK.

This is a constant uphill battle, not just for law enforcement, but for parents and us that work with children, we cannot take our eye off the ball.
