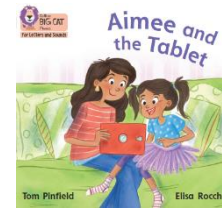

UPDATE – Coronavirus

Dear Parents and Carers,

I want to share the school and Trust's current position on how we are managing concerns regarding Coronavirus.

We receive a daily update from the Department for Education that shares any new information and advice. The only pertinent information that [has been shared](#) with school is to encourage children to wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds. We have increased the opportunities for this to happen in school |

You may have heard talk of school closures. It is a population distancing strategy. We have not had any communications from the Local Authority nor the Department for Education to say that this is going to happen. However, we have had discussions at school-level to ensure that we can maintain your child's education as best we can.

We have made provisional plans to ensure that children have access to "Purple Mash", our online learning platform, and work [will be provided](#) in paper form and on the school website for you to access, as and when required. All children will receive plenty of books to read! [This will only be needed](#), if the Government advise school closures.

I hope that none of the above will be [required](#), however, we would rather be over-prepared and use our time, than be under-prepared and 'lose' your child's learning time! We will keep you updated if anything changes.

SCHOOL IS STILL OPEN AND CHILDREN MUST ATTEND.
