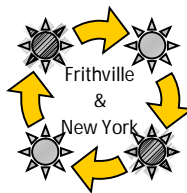

Home School Agreement – Covid-19 Support Document

Dear Parents and Carers,

During this time of hardship, our school community has worked together tremendously to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our children. Your support for us had been wonderful. This addition to our Home School Agreement provides an update and highlights some new commitments we expect parents to make whilst also summarising the additional action the school will make during this period.

This document applies during the period of the school's phased reopening and continued operation until all additional national measures for hygiene and distancing are lifted. Our existing Home School Agreement continues to apply throughout this period.

Our Home School Agreement, together with this support document applies to all pupils currently attending both Frithville and New York Primary Schools, including those for whom the attendance is temporary due to Covid-19.

Parents agree to:

1. Abide by government guidance as it evolves, including following the rules on social distancing.
2. Follow the new pick up and drop off rules set by the school. This includes:
 - a. Arriving on time and only at the times specified for your child.
 - b. Socially distancing at the school gates and on the journey to and from school: please stay at least 2 metres away from others.
 - c. Only one parent/carer at pick up/drop off - if possible, please leave other children at home
 - d. Parents only to enter school by appointment only (last resort), please phone or email wherever possible.
3. Not send your child into school if he/she is unwell or presents symptoms of Covid-19. A suspected case of COVID-19 is defined as an individual with the following symptoms:
 - a high temperature
 - a new, continuous cough
 - a loss of, or change to, sense of smell or taste
4. Pick your child up from school as soon as possible if you are informed your child is unwell or presenting any Covid-19 symptoms.
5. Ensure your child attends school in freshly washed clothes each day of attendance – this does not need to be school uniform.
6. Ensure you and your child (and any other child you need to bring with you) washes their hands properly before attending school.
7. Communicate with the school about the attendance of your child on a timely basis.

The school has:

1. Carried out a detailed Covid-19 Risk Assessment which we will keep under review as matters progress.
2. Carried out detailed planning and organisation for the wider reopening, with detailed consideration of government guidance.
3. Introduced an enhanced cleaning schedule and introduced new hygiene and hand washing procedures for all staff and pupils.

4. Reviewed and updated our Safeguarding procedures
5. Limited class sizes to 10.
6. Planned to increase our use of outside space for teaching and learning.
7. Staggered lunch and break times to reduce contact between groups of children and staff.
8. Put in place training on all new rules and procedures and introduced social distancing measures for school staff. We also carried out a specific employee risk assessment.
9. Created a dedicated separate room for anyone with Covid-19 symptoms and put in place detailed procedures for anyone who falls unwell whilst at school
10. Ordered Personal Protective Equipment to be ready for the limited times for when it will need to be used, for example when a person falls unwell with Covid-19 symptoms
11. Please refer to the plan and FAQs documents attached with this agreement.
12. Class teachers will contact all parents before their child/ren are due to start back at school.


The above list highlights some of the most relevant protective measures we have taken in order make the school as safe a space as possible to care for your children during this time, this list is not exhaustive and the measures taken will continue to adapt and evolve as matters progress.

We will seek parental support should your child make either themselves, or others vulnerable to risk of infection, by their inability to observe school's Covid-19 social distancing practices, as detailed in our Trust approved risk assessments, Policies and in adherence to DfE guidance.

Could you please sign the agreement below with the understanding that you have read the agreement and have explained its content to your children. Please return the document to school on the first day of return. There will be copies available to sign on arrival. We will also be spending a great deal of time explaining the new rules to the children on their arrival.

Thank you again for all your support throughout the enforcement closure. If you have any questions about the plans, policies, guidance or documents provided, please do not hesitate to ask.
